SYNOPSIS

Summer holidays are over and it's time for a reunion between the boys from Shiverstone Castle and the girls from the Rosenfels School. THE DIRECTOR

Director and screenwriter Ralf Huettner was born in Munich in 1954 and studied at the University of Television and Film from 1981 to 1985. Huettner marked his film debut in 1987 with the fairy-tale tragicomedy CRIPPLES GO CHRISTMAS, for which he won the European Film Award in 1988.

As director of the television series DR. PSYCHO — DIE BÖSEN, DIE BULLEN, MEINE FRAU UND ICH, Huettner won the Adolf Grimme Award in 2008. Two years later he directed the film VINCENT WANTS TO SEA. The drama was highly successful with audiences and won many awards, including the Audience Prize at the Bavarian Film Awards in 2010 and Golden Lola for Best Film at the German Film Awards. For his work, he was awarded the first-ever Metropolis Prize from the German Federal Association of Directors in 2011.
